December 2017 Competition

CBU Researchers:

The December competition deadline for applications for the [Nova Scotia Innovation & Research Graduate Scholarship Program](#) is approaching. This arrangement secures an allotment of awards to be made available to applicants who are entering a thesis-based graduate program at Dalhousie University in May of 2018 or September of 2018.

Eligible students are required to have attained a 3.7 grade point average, have applied for admission to a Dalhousie program by January 15, 2018 (**individual departments/programs may have earlier deadlines**) and intend to undertake their research within one of the [Nova Scotia priority research areas](#) under the direction of a Dalhousie supervisor and a CBU co-supervisor. **Applicants should be in communication with Dalhousie and the department to which they are applying to ensure they adhere to all regulations, processes and deadlines required.**

Potential CBU co-supervisors are required to have Dalhousie adjunct status with the department in which the applicant has registered.

Supervisors are also hereby notified that any **applicants, who are interested in being included in the CBU-Dalhousie partnership allotment, must submit the attached application package to the CBU Office of Research and Graduate Studies studentresearch@cbu.ca prior to November 1st, 2017**. Their application will be adjudicated for recommendation for a Nova Scotia Research and Innovation Graduate Scholarship. Recommendations will be forwarded to Dalhousie University as the institution responsible for issuing and announcing these awards.

Recommendation of a candidate will be based upon tri-council scholarly selection criteria.

6. CONFIRMATION: Provide a confirmation letter/email from both Dalhousie and CBU personnel who have committed to serve as your supervisors.

7. TRANSCRIPTS: Provide a copy of Official Transcripts.
