

RESPONDING TO REPORTS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT within 72 hours

ENSURE THE IMMEDIATE SAFETY OF THE PERSON REPORTING

If emergency medical assistance is required on campus, call Campus Security at **(902) 578-2316**

If the assault has occurred within the last 72 hours, it is important to preserve physical evidence, treat any physical injuries and test for sexually transmitted infections or pregnancy.

Is the individual interested in seeking medical attention?

YES

Discourage them from showering, changing clothes, eating or drinking prior to receiving medical attention to preserve forensic evidence.

Proceed to the emergency department at Cape Breton Regional Hospital.

Is the individual interested in making a police report?

If they do not wish to report the incident you may advise them to document the incident in as much detail as they can remember for their own record.
