A number of CBU courses are available by distance (paper or online), including some of the required courses for the Bachelor of Engineering Technology degree programs and may, in some instances, be the only offering of that particular course that year. CBU distance courses can be used to fulfill the credit residency requirement. |
| | Graduation requirement: For this three year program, a minimum of all courses in the program (or approved equivalent) must be completed to be eligible for graduation. |

| 1. a completed application form, with non-refundable application fee |
| 2. official transcripts for all previous post-secondary study |
| 3. a resume detailing employment experience, skills, community involvement and |
| interests |
| 4. a 500-800 word statement on desire to enter the program |
| 5. three reference letters, preferably including one professional and one |
| academic reference, each accompanied by a completed reference form |
| 6. satisfactory performance in an interview |
| 7. Reference letters must be originals, sent directly by the referees. Only official |
| transcripts sent by the Registrar of the issuing institution will be accepted. Photocopies |
| of any of these documents will not be accepted. |
| Language Proficiency: English is the primary language of instruction at Cape Breton University. It is essential that all students have an adequate knowledge in the areas of reading, writing, listening and speaking in the English language in order for them to be successful in their studies. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that their English is at a level of accomplishment necessary for their particular programs and specific requirements. Applicants whose first language is not English normally need to provide documentation to show that CBU's English language proficiency requirements have been met. | Course Credit Minimum: The CBU MBA-CED degree program requires the completion of a minimum of 36 credits of course work (see Appendices A & B) after successfully completed Humber College programs as outline above. This normally requires a minimum of three semesters of full time study to complete. On a part time basis, the program can be completed over three intensive residencies in the month of July: students can take classes for all required courses by spending three July sessions on campus. The program is also offered on select weekends in Edmonton, Saskatoon, and Toronto. |
| Electives: Students in MBA-CED degree program are advised to consult with the MBA Program Director, Coordinator or a faculty advisor for options of the elective courses. |
| Residency and distance courses: A number of CBU courses are available by distance (paper or online), including some of the required courses for the MBA-CED degree programs and may, in some instances, be the only offering of that particular course that year. CBU distance courses can be used to fulfill the credit residency requirement. |
| Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) Credits: Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) credits will not be granted for any required CBU credits indicated in this Agreement. |
| Start Times: There are three start times for the program on campus: September, January, or July. The off-campus program is offered on alternate-weekends and operates on continuous intake, although September (Edmonton, Toronto) or January (Saskatoon) tends to be the best start times. |
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| | Program Delivery: MBA in CED is offered on our Sydney, Nova Scotia campus, on full- time and part-time basis. It is also offered in four different Canadian cities, including Toronto, Edmonton, Saskatoon and Whitehorse on a part-time basis. Semester Format Delivery The semester format delivery follows the September – April academic year on campus in Sydney. Deadline for application is September 30, for a January start. Deadline for application is May 31, for a September start. Modular Semester Format Delivery The modular format appeals to working adults. It includes short, on-site residencies followed by deliverables paced over a 12 week period. This residential program enables learners to take four to five classes each July in Sydney and thus complete all program coursework over three July residencies (26 months). Deadline for application is March 31, for a July start. Note: Students can combine the semester format and modular format delivery to complete the program in 12 months. Weekend Format Delivery (off campus) Learners can opt to complete the program in 22 months by attending classes on alternate weekends in certain cities across Canada, including Edmonton and Saskatoon. Please contact mba@cbu.ca regarding application deadlines and venues. MBA-CED students admitted via this articulation agreement must complete the total number of credits of course work conveyed in this document for their selected MBA-CED option to receive this Degree. Further, all of these course credits must be taken through Cape Breton University.
