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5. Report of the President, Vice-President (Academic & Research) and Students' Union

5.1 President's report

President Harker was not at today's meeting due to illness, therefore there was no President's Report.

5.2 Report of Vice-President (Academic & Research)

Dr. Robert Bailey, Vice-President (Academic & Research) gave a verbal report. Highlights included:

- He referred to the recent announcement regarding the replacement of the School of Education, Health, and Wellness with the School of Graduate and Professional Studies as of July 1, 2010. He will assume the duties of Interim Dean while an open search is being conducted to hire a Dean. It is expected that the Dean be in place by July 1, 2011.
- He attended the inaugural meeting of the Atlantic Deans of Graduate Studies in Halifax.
- He commented on the evolution of the Mi'kmaq College Institute to Unama'ki College of Cape Breton University. He announced the Principal of Unama'ki College is Lindsay Marshall and the Interim Vice-Principal is Dr. Rod Nicholls. An open search for a permanent Vice-Principal will be conducted over the next several months and it is expected to have this person in place by July 1, 2011.
- He, along with Vice-President, Student Services, A. Manley, and Special Assistant to the Vice-President (Academic and Research), Dr. Léandre Desjardins, attended a Strategic Management Enrollment meeting in Halifax.

Dr. Bailey referred to two documents circulated with the agenda package - the Proposed Policy and Procedure for Appointment of Adjunct Faculty Members and the Proposed Criteria and Procedures for the Emeritus Honorific. He asked Senate for direction regarding the disposition of the documents.

Dr. Bailey responded to an inquiry regarding what impact, if any, the change of the name of the School of Arts and Community Studies to School of Arts and Social Studies will have on programming, noting that it will have no effect.

- (b) Bylaws and Procedures Committee Chair, T. Urbaniak gave a verbal report. He commented the Committee is examining the responsibilities and the concerns regarding the workload of the Academic committee. On the matter of streamlining the degree, diploma and certificate committees, he noted a preliminary recommendation has been formulated, however not yet put into legal language, and the issue will be re-visited at the next scheduled committee meeting. He commented that feedback on these issues would be welcomed.
- (c) Nominating committee Chair, C. Taylor, noted there is no report for this meeting.
- (d) Planning & Priorities Chair, C. Pyne, gave a verbal report. He commented that P & P had one meeting with the four School representatives on the Budget Advisory committee. He also advised that the committee, at its' last meeting, reviewed the draft document relating to the Unama'ki College at CBU.
 - Dr. Urbaniak expressed his concerns regarding the Budget Advisory process and in particular his concern that academic planning is not driving budget planning.
- (e) Quality Assurance, Chair, W. Wadden, noted there was no report for this meeting.
- (f) Research, Chair, G. Carre referred to the document circulated electronically announcing the RP grants. The Chair noted that the Research Assistance committee is currently reviewing the criteria/process for the awarding of the grants and encouraged Senators to inform the Research Committee of any concerns they have regarding the process.
- **Teaching, Learning, and Evaluation** Chair, M. Biernstiel referred to the report circulated with the agenda package.

He noted the following deletions/additions to the CBU Policy on the Use of Recordings of Course Presentations:

- 1) Section 2. Distribution of Recordings of Course Presentations, 4th line, remove the word 'presentation'.
- 2) Under item iii, last line insert the word "Accessibility" to read 'the Jennifer Keeping Accessibility Centre'

<u>Motion</u>

It was moved by M. Bierenstiel, seconded by M. Silverberg that Senate adopt the CBU Policy on the Use of Recordings of Course Presentations.

On the question: A lengthy discussion followed. Questions/concerns were raised regarding whether or not this policy affects or applies to note-takers for the Jennifer Keeping Accessibility Centre; clarification of the term 'course presentation' and whether the policy is 'appended' to or 'attached' to the CBU Teaching Policy document; concerns

regarding the quality of the notes; misinterpretation of the lecture material and the dissemination of that misinterpreted information; intellectual property rights; and the ability to enforce this policy.

The Chair noted there was a good discussion regarding the issue. He advised that if members were not ready to approve the policy, the best course of action would be to make a motion to refer it back to the Teaching, Learning and Evaluation committee for further examination and comment. However, if members were ready to approve it, he would call for the question.

Motion

It was moved by M. Silverberg, seconded by E. LeBlanc to refer the document back to the Committee for further examination and comment. **Motion carried.**

On a point of order, the Chair declared the meeting had lost quorum and was therefore adjourned (3:40 pm).
