



INTERESTED IN A CAREER AS A FRENCH TEACHER?

**Come to Cape Breton University and
earn both a Bachelor of Arts Degree
and a Bachelor of Education Degree.**

Becoming a French teacher is an exciting and marketable career opportunity. At Cape Breton University you can become a French Teacher faster than you may think. By completing a 3-year Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree followed by our 16-month Bachelor of Education (BEd) degree, you will be classroom-ready in as little as 4.5 years.

ADVANCED STANDING TO THE BA PROGRAM

There are opportunities to get advanced standing as you apply to enter an undergraduate program at CBU.

Students who have completed their studies in Canada may be granted up to 6 credits of French if you are entering with coursework from the Explore Summer Language Bursary Program (courses must be at the intermediate level or higher and a minimum grade of C is earned); have completed a French Immersion program through to Grade 12, or completed their education through a French school as recognized by CBU (if an overall average of 75% is achieved in the courses delivered in French or successful completion of the DELF B2 assessment test is achieved); or if you have completed IB French 12 (with a minimum score of 5).

BONUS UNDERGRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES TO BOOST YOUR FRENCH!

There are great opportunities for adventure during your Bachelor of Arts experience. You may be able to take advantage of paid opportunities to complete French immersion training during the summer months at Université Sainte-Anne in Church Point, NS or in Quebec or Québec or Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon, if you have completed a year of full-time study or are entering a full-time year of university study in September.

You may also decide to spend some time studying in France through CBU's study abroad program during third or fourth year of your undergraduate degree.

Teaching Elementary or Middle School/High School Education – you decide!

If your undergrad degree includes 30 credits in French coursework, you may choose to prepare to teach in the Elementary grades or the Secondary grades of Middle School/High School.

If you choose the secondary grades route, with some strategic course planning, you will be able to graduate with three teachable disciplines, rather than the two required by NS Teacher Certification. Adding a third teachable discipline increases your flexibility and professional career opportunities.

When the 3-year degree is completed, you move directly into the BEd program to begin learning how to teach these disciplines.

The Bachelor of Education degree begins in May of your graduation year, so in just 16 months you can be applying to be a licensed French teacher in Nova Scotia and any other Province or Territory in Canada.

To maximize your career opportunities, you will have access to national and international recruiters to help you find the teaching position that is right for you.

Cape Breton University is recognized for the individual attention students receive in small classes led by dedicated instructors. The CBU BEd is also a unique program, as it is the only BEd program in the province to offer an Indigenous Concentration option and the only one with a focus on Education for Sustainability.

The demand for French teachers continues to grow. Internationally, there is a global shortage of professionally certified teachers. Career opportunities include public and private school classrooms, adult education, college instruction and many opportunities that extend beyond the classroom.

Students preparing for the Elementary grade levels route, you will complete a concentration in French (30-credits) plus the requirements for Elementary Education:

Elementary Education/French Focus

30 credits	French coursework
6 credits	English coursework
6 credits	Social Studies coursework
6 credits	Mathematics coursework
6 credits	Science coursework
3 credits	Developmental Psychology

**Plus 3 credits in Critical Studies course work. This coursework may be fulfilled by requirements above.*
