You may revise your papers before submitting them for judging, and you may permit instructors to submit essays on your behalf.
- 2. Include a cover letter indicating your name, address, telephone number, the title of your essay, the name of the instructor and class for which you originally submitted the essay, and the category you are entering (Mary Keshen English Prize or Shauna Gillis Prize).
