As part of CBU's agreement with CIC, students registered in the Dual Option at CIC will receive a degree from each institution (CIC & CBU) upon meeting the program requirements by either completing their program fully at CIC or by taking part in a Transfer or Exchange opportunity at CBU.

This opportunity allows students to broaden their personal and educational perspectives, explore and appreciate new cultures while becoming more independent and resourceful. Students will learn from an array of professors with different teaching backgrounds who will help provide a well-rounded and full university experience.

Benefits for Students

The partnership between **CIC** and **CBU** helps broaden your personal and educational perspectives. *Transferring* or *exchanging* to CBU provides the opportunity to explore and appreciate new cultures, widen university boundaries, and learn from an array of professors with different teaching backgrounds. This experience nurtures personal growth and allows you to become more independent and resourceful.

Exchange Program

CIC and CBU implemented a Student Exchange Agreement to enhance the educational and cross-cultural experience of students from both institutions.

The period of exchange is for a minimum of one academic term or a maximum of two consecutive academic terms. Exchange to CBU can only occur in the Fall (September) term.

Eligibility to Exchange To CBU

- Completed at least one year at CIC
- Minimum overall average of 75% over the previous two semesters with no failures
- Must be registered as a full-time student in your last two terms prior to the Fall term at CBU
- Must provide proof of English Language Proficiency
- At least 19 years of age

A maximum of five students can exchange at CBU each academic year. CIC students enrolled in the student Exchange program will not be eligible for CBU Academic Scholarship.

Transfer Program

As part of the CIC and CBU agreement, CIC students enrolled in the Dual Option can transfer to CBU.

Students can only transfer to CBU in the Fall (September) term. CIC students may transfer to CBU for as many academic terms until graduation as they wish.

Eligibility to Transfer to CBU

- Completed at least one year at CIC
- Minimum overall average of 65% over the previous two semesters with no failures
- Must be registered as a full-time student in your last two terms prior to the Fall (September) term at CBU
- Must provide proof of English Language Proficiency

Tuition and Fees

Tuition estimates for international students under the Transfer program taking ten (10) undergraduate-level courses per academic year (30 credits):

• Tuition: \$9,045.00

International medical plan: \$1,283.00
International differential fees: \$9,045.00

• Fees: \$764.30

Total: \$20,137.30

Students with Canadian Citizenship applying to transfer to CBU will not be charged International Differential fees upon their Transfer.

Scholarships

The first 20 CIC Transfer students meeting the eligibility criteria and transferring to CBU are entitled to an Academic Scholarship that will be applied to academic tuition fees only.

Scholarship Conditions:

- Be registered in at least eight courses or more over the two terms spent at CBU (four courses/term)
- The Academic Scholarship is for one academic year only: September April and is non-renewable.
- Minimum overall average of 70% over the previous two semesters with no failures.

CIC Exchange students do not fall under this scholarship category.

Studying in Canada

Several documents are required to study as an international student in Canada. It is your responsibility as a student to maintain your immigration status and comply with immigration regulations while you are here.

- Study Permit
- Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) or Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA)

It is important to apply for your study permit as soon as you have received your Cape Breton University acceptance letter.

To apply, you will need to identify the university by its designated learning institution number (DLI) on the study permit application form.


