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Land Acknowledgement

Cape Breton University acknowledges it is located in Unama'ki, one of the seven districts of Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq, Wolastoqiyik and Passamaquoddy People first signed with the British Crown in 1726. The treaties did not deal with the surrender of lands and resources but, in fact, recognized Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

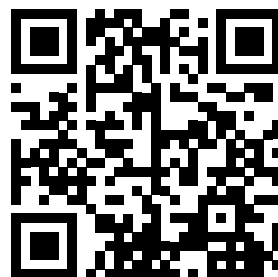

Research

Cape Breton University researchers study topics that address real-world affairs. From pursuing community-engaged research to forging partnerships in public health and environmental sustainability, CBU faculty – with the support of student research assistants – are responding to local, national and international realities.

These efforts continue to be recognized through prestigious awards including a recent investment of \$12.4 million from Research Nova Scotia to support CBU's Dr. Alison Grittner, faculty in the Bachelor of Social Work program, in a seven-year research project to develop and pilot supports for rural Nova Scotians to age in the right place. Currently underway, this project marks the largest research grant in CBU's history and is a notable example of how CBU's research efforts are making a difference to academics, students and communities.

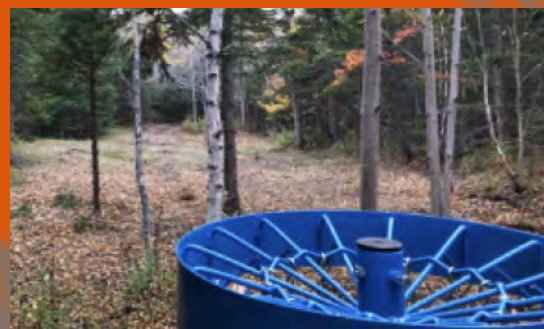

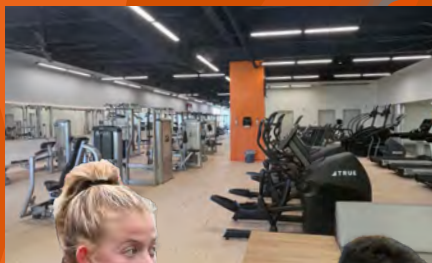

Disc Golf Course

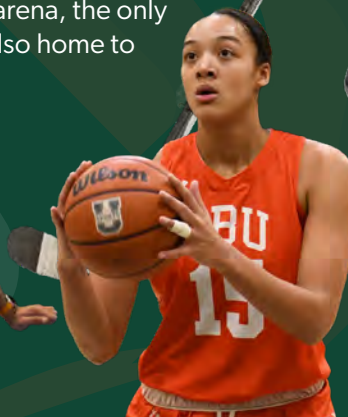
A first within Canadian post-secondary institutions, CBU's disc golf course offers an 18-hole layout that weaves through the scenic trails surrounding the campus.





Kehoe Forum

CBU's Kehoe Forum, formerly the Canada Games Complex, has recently undergone a transformative \$38 million upgrade cementing its status as the proud Home of Women's Hockey. Originally built for the 1987 Canada Games, this multifaceted sports hub has been fully renovated to include an expanded Nancy Dingwall Health & Counselling Centre, a brand new fitness facility, an indoor walking track and a fully accessible ice surface for sledge hockey. Serving students, faculty, and the broader community as an elite performance training centre and large-scale event space, the Kehoe Forum is home to the CAPERS Women's Hockey Team and the Cape Breton Blizzard Female Hockey Association which consists of more than 500 girls and young women at all levels of play. The fully accessible arena, the only one of its kind in Cape Breton, is also home to the Cape Breton Sledgehammers.



At CBU, we're dedicated to supporting our student-athletes. Our CAPERS athletic teams are comprised of top student-athletes from across the globe, representing Cape Breton University in men's and women's basketball, soccer, and women's hockey. Formed in 1982 under the U Sports Association, the CAPERS have seen great successes throughout their legacy as nationally ranked champions.

**Students who have their own coverage through an employer, a parent, or sponsored by an Indigenous Band Council, are eligible to opt-out of (drop) the CBU Students' Union plan.

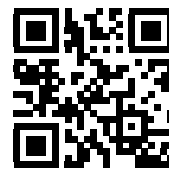
