

#### Thursday, October 16 Tara Johnson and River Stevens

Tara Johnson is from Potlotek First Nation and has been practicing Mi'kmaw art since she was a child. She started beading at 16 when her parents bought her her first bead from the late Agnes Gould (Aggie Baby), a well-known beader from Membertou. Learning Mi'kmaw art has helped Tara reconnect with her culture, from beading and quillwork to sewing.

River Stevens is from Eskasoni First Nation and has also been practicing L'nu art since they were young. They gravitated toward drawing, which led them down a path of rediscovering their cultural roots through the recreation of Mi'kmaq paintings. River began their journey using pigments to help teach and honour their ancestors.

Eve Croft is a self-taught artist specializing in special effects and bleach painting, among other creative pursuits. Over the past three years, Eve has had the privilege of contributing her gory, imaginative talents to a number of short horror films and music videos.
